

‘Flute Medicine’ reaping awards, nominations

“Flute Medicine,” the most recent compact disc released by Tribal Lands Manager and multiple Native American Music Awards recipient Jan Michael Looking Wolf Reibach, has started receiving numerous awards and nominations.



The CD received two Silver Medal Awards for Outstanding Achievement from the Global Music Awards in the Album and Instrumentalist categories. According to its Facebook page, the Global Music Awards is a top music competition that honors talented musicians around the world and receiving an award puts a “stamp of credibility for gifted, emerging musicians.”

Meanwhile, the release was nominated for Best Native American Album by the One World Music Radio Awards, which will be announced on Sunday, June 3. “Flute Medicine” joined “Harmony” by Jay Michael, “Enchantment Blooms” by Nouveau Papillion, “Medicine Wheel” by Painted Raven, “Fuego” by Rushingwind and the Native Groove and “Shaman” by Wychazel in the category.

One World Music is the No. 1 radio station in Europe that concentrates on broadcasting world music and “Flute Medicine” debuted at No. 5 on the station’s Top 100 chart in December.

And the Canadian Indigenous Music Awards nominated “Flute Medicine” as the Best Instrumental Album along with “The Flute Player & the Singer” by Chamakese & Gladue, “Reckoning” by Melody McKiver, “Miigis” by Red Sky Performance and “Rushingwind” by Steven Rushingwind. The awards will be given out at the Manito Ahbee Music Festival being held May 16-20 in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada.
