Oregon Battle of the Books 2018-19: Available at the Tribal Library. The following book reviews are two titles from the elementary-level Oregon Battle of the Books titles.

Book Reviews: "In the Footsteps of Crazy Horse" by Joseph Marshall III.

The difference between a good book and a great one is how easy the pages turn as I paint the picture and how I can put myself into the story. Both of these are true with "In the Footsteps of Crazy Horse." This book is relatable on so many levels. Young men, grandparents, history buffs, Native pride and the freedom to get out and explore on a long road trip, camping, staying from town to town. One cannot help but become wiser from experiencing a getaway. I know I'm wiser from reading this wonderfully written, sad story, which is about a loss of life and an end to a way of life. Marshall ties it all together full circle so the story can help in empowering youths of the seventh generation.

The following is the last spoken vision that Crazy Horse said in 1877, approximately seven generations ago. It was retold by Chief Joe Chasing Horse, a relative of Crazy Horse. He translated it from the words of his grandmother who was present when the words were spoken, when Crazy Horse sat smoking a sacred pipe with Sitting Bull for the very last time. Four days later he was slain.

"Upon suffering beyond suffering; the Red Nation shall rise again and it shall be a blessing for a sick world. A world filled with broken promises, selfishness and separations. A world longing for light again. I see a time of seven generations when all the colors of mankind will gather under the sacred Tree of Life and the whole Earth will become one circle again. In that day, there will be those among the Lakota who will carry knowledge and understanding of unity among all living things, and the young white ones will come to those of my people and ask for this wisdom. I salute the light within your eyes where the whole universe dwells. For when you are at that center within you and I am at that place within me, we shall be as one." — Jeff Davidson
