Book review: “Magnus Chase and the Gods of Asgard: The Sword of Summer” by Rick Riordan.

After one terrifying night two years ago, 16-year-old Magnus Chase has been living homeless on the streets of Boston. One day an uncle his mother told him to never trust tracks him down. The uncle claims an impossible truth — that Magus is the son of a Norse god. Magnus soon learns that the old Viking myths are true and he must search for a weapon to prevent Ragnarok, the Day of Doom.

With the help of his street smarts, Magnus journeys through the nine realms, using his skills, courage and moments of pure wit to defeat his enemies.

If you are looking for a highly entertaining and adventurous read, this is the book for you. “The Sword of Summer” is a cleverly funny book that will put a smile on your face. 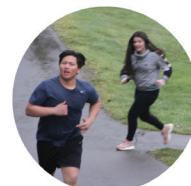
