Book Review: “Flowers for Algernon” by Daniel Keyes.
Daniel Keyes took me on a journey with this story. He wrote a great science fiction novel that really touches on human emotion.
I went into this story thinking it was about a mouse named Algernon, which was a big misunderstanding on my part. While Algernon is a supporting character, this story is about Charlie Gordon. He’s an intellectually disabled man who undergoes an experimental brain operation to drastically increase his IQ, an operation that Algernon previously underwent with success.
Charlie has a vague understanding of what the operation risks are, but he just wants nothing more than to be smart, valued and loved. He’s hoping this operation will give that to him. After the operation, we go on a journey with Charlie as he tries to understand and navigate human emotions, social cues and absorb as much information as possible.
Keyes uses spelling, grammar and sentence structure to convey where Charlie is at developmentally. You see where he’s starting at intellectually, then you see his growth and understanding as his intelligence reaches new heights and where he lands at the end of the story.
Keyes created a remarkable character that shows emotional intelligence is every bit as important as mental intelligence. “Flowers for Algernon” left me thinking about what is really important in life and appreciating what I do have. — *Reviewed by Crystal Bigelow*
