96 employees honored for 1,278 years of service

The Lenos led the way as 96 Tribal employees who were hired in the second quarter – April through June – reached the anniversary of their hire date with five or more years of service.

The 96 employees have a combined 1,278 years of service to the Grand Ronde Tribe.

During previous years, summer honorees and other Tribal employees typically feasted on a lunchtime barbecue picnic held in the Tribal gym. However, due to the recent surge of the COVID-19 pandemic's Delta variant, the scheduled Aug. 19 barbecue was canceled.

Eighteen employees were honored for serving 20 or more years, led by Lead Groundskeeper Greg Leno, who hit the 33-year mark. He is only the second Tribal employee ever to achieve this status.


