Eddy says that these spark signals may come rom an outer planet, because electricity travels at the rate of 190,000 miles a second and is as tireless as light, which travels at the rate of 188,500 miles a secured. Great variability in effect is produced when there is apparently no change whatever in the condition of the upper air, so far as known.
