EDITORIAL.

 A Washington dispatch says that one of the most irascible officials abroad reports that
 "If the whole horror of the murder, pillage and devastation between Peking and Peking were to be considered in the United States and Europe the sum of it is so great as compared with the number of Christians who have suffered at the hands of the Chinese that rightly or wrongly the Chinese are likely to be held the injured party. Lancers, warring against the little children by the weapons in the streets of Peking, are some of the last of the well-ventilated lancers, and to some foreign children a dead Chinese Christian is just as much a joy as a dead horse; they neither know nor care for such trifling little incidents."
 The Chinese estimate that one million of their people have lost their lives by violent deaths or starvation about Peking and Tsin Tsin since the allied came. Well known foreigners long residents here do not regard the estimate as exaggerated.
 The North China News of March 28 says: "Simply because Chinese civil authorities has been suppressed, hurried, driven away and nothing substituted for it, the country between the sea and Peking has been depopulated and the people have been killed and/or driven out of their homes to become bandits. Washed heads thought that one of the first acts of the foreign who returned after Peking was restored would have been to strengthen the Chinese civil authorities and make it responsible for the preservation of order, this was not only refused but sponsored by the allies and they have only sold to the show a disposition to let matters remain as they are. The only thing that has been done is to temporarily take away a number of small towns and villages near the coast."
