From the Oregonian. The drift of Europe is to state socialism. It is seen in Germany, in France, in Italy and even Great Britain. A socialist member of Parliament, Keir Hardie, recently offered a resolution providing for the transformation of the United Kingdom into a socialistic commonwealth...

State socialism has friends in this country who, after the recent panic in the stock market, consequent upon the struggle between railway giants for the supremacy, declared that if those railways had been under Government ownership and control...

Carroll D. Wright, who does not pretend to be a socialist, argues in the Philadelphia Times that the natural ultimate of socialization of capital will be government ownership. The economic trend is logically in that direction.

It is further pointed out that the great department stores in our large cities represent an economic trend to state socialism; it is the effort of the capitalist to socialize capital. Organized labor is beginning to favor state socialism because, while it is willing that capital should have a large share in the benefits arising from the application of power machinery...

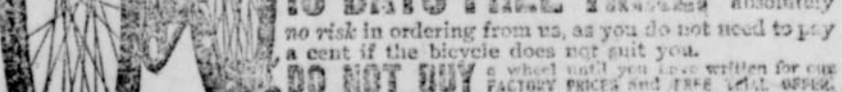
