EDITORIAL

The Socialist vote of Bandon precinct can safely be estimated at 47 votes, which represents a gain of over 261 percent in 10 months.

Press reports stated that Mark Hanna was anxious to hear from Oregon. We wonder how he likes the rattle of her musketry and the boom of her canon.

Japan is taking on civilization in rapid strides. Two of its officials are now in the United States for the purpose of transacting a loan of \$100,000,000. Civilization and indebtedness seem to be closely allied.

The Oregonian is a great journal, but not with standing its greatness, it does some huge blowing along about election time to carry its points.

Some of the opposition papers are calling Mr. Furnish "boss", "grafter", etc. However after election it will be plain Governor Furnish—M. P. Entergras.

It was all a mistake. It is plain Governor Chamberlain.

The leaders of the Western Federation of Miners and the Western Labor Union have declared for Socialism. This accession means an addition of over 100,000 voters in the Western states who will cast their influence and vote with the Socialists.

The vote of Bandon precinct shows a remarkable increase in the Socialist party. At the Presidential election of 1900 there were 13 Socialist votes for the elector receiving the highest number of votes, and at Monday's election S. J. Tuttle received 53 votes for county commissioner which shows a gain of 40 votes, which is above 307 per cent.

At a recent mass meeting of the citizens of Lebanon, Tenn., it was reported that since abolishing the saloon in that city there had been an increase of from 25 to 47 1/2 per cent in trade and of 20 per cent in real estate, while only one-third as many cases have been tried in the criminal court.

The power of alcohol upon the nervous system to establish a "habit" is one of its most dangerous qualities and makes it a thing to be avoided. No one knows when he takes his first glass of beer or wine or cider, whether it may not be his fate to become a victim of the habit—Henry F. Howes, Instructor in Physiological Chemistry, Harvard.

Twenty Cigaretts Kill Forty Frogs.

That the cigaret is a deadly poison is susceptible of the most positive scientific proof. A few months ago I had all the nicotine removed from a cigaret, making a solution of it. I injected half the quantity into a frog with the effect that the frog died almost instantly. The other half was administered to another frog with like effect. Both frogs were full grown, and of average size. The conclusion is evident that a single cigaret contains poison enough to kill two frogs. A boy who smokes twenty cigarettes a day has libaled enough poison to kill forty frogs. Why does the poison not kill him? If not immediately, he will die sooner or later of weak heart, Bright's disease or some other malady which scientific physicians everywhere now recognize as the natural result of chronic nicotine poisoning.—Dr. J. H. Kellogg, Battle Creek, Mich.

Ban On Cigaret.

The auditors of the Santa Fe rail road, at a meeting held last month in Las Vegas, entered into an agreement to employ no more cigaret smokers in their departments. Notices have been posted in the offices in forming the employees of this action. At this meeting the auditors gave their experience with cigaret smokers. Their decision was unanimous that the men addicted to the use of cigarettes could not be depended upon to do acceptable work in the auditing department of the Santa Fe railway system.

This is but the beginning of a movement which will in the course of time become universal.
