Breakers Ahead.

London, June 5.—The negotiations of the British and the Canadian Government and some of the other Colonial Governments with the Cunard Line and other lines comprising what is now termed the Liverpool syndicate, which is opposing the Morgan shipping combine, contemplate, according to the Westminster Gazette, both a fast service of mail and passenger steamers, in conjunction with the Canadian Pacific Railroad, and a fleet of fast freight steamers.

The scheme contemplates a line of steamers running to China, Japan and Australia, from Vancouver, B. C. Canada and Australia are expected to join in paying the subsidies. A draft of the scheme involves the home government guaranteeing a small interest on the capital involved.

London, June 5.—According to the Shipping Gazette, J. P. Morgan is not concerned in any way in the proposed Cunard scheme, which the same authority understands will be an "all British" project.

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London, June 6.—According to the Daily Mail, the American Line will not join the British shipping combination, but will remain an active competitor on the outside.
