One of the most exciting as well as one of the mostly evenly contested games of the season took place on the Marshfield Recreation Grounds last Sunday between the "Marshfield Prodigals" and the "Bandon Loo Loo's," the latter winning by a 5 to a "goose egg" score.

The Prodigals were strengthened by "Miguel Fisher Suort's" three new crackerjacks" who are indeed a great great strength to their team and entered the game with a strong determination to break Bandon's winning streak. But our boys were right there with the goods to sell, and they sold them with a profit on which they are now "living easy."

The game commenced with two cow bells and one thousand "lusty lings" to help the Prodigals along, and for 7 innings the bells, etc., kept up their incessant clatter, when suddenly in the 8th inning the Bandon boys sent two men across the table.
