Important News Notes

THURSDAY AUG 25 The Reliance won second race with Shamrock III, by 1 minute, 19 seconds. Sec. Root has resigned and Taft will succeed him. Change takes effect next Jan. Population of three Bulgarian villages massacred by Circassians. Turkey refuses to let Americans dig in Babylonia after three years of preparation and the expenditure of over \$6,000. Six deaths resulted from heat in Chicago.

WEDNESDAY AUG 26 Sultan calls reserves to join colors which means a massing of 350 battalions of soldiers in Macedonia. In a sham battle fought during the early morning, the warships ran batteries and captured Portland, Me. Several hundred Chinese lose their lives in a flood caused by cloudburst, at Che Foo. Four masked men held up the Featherstone Bangh miners, in Atlin, Alaska, and escaped with \$20,000.

THURSDAY AUG 27 Yatch race declared off. Wind too light to finish in time. U. S. Government orders Admiral Cotton, commanding the European Squadron to be in readiness to move on Turkey. Officials at Leech Lake Agency greatly alarmed at threatened uprising of Minnesota Indians. The East bound daily express from Bandon to Constantine was blown up and 7 persons were killed and 15 injured. Outrage supposed to be work of revolutionists who travelled on the train.

FRIDAY AUG 28 Assassin of Vice-Consul Magellon, at Beirut, Syria, is unknown, and as yet there are no details. Sir Thomas Lipton is discouraged. He will not challenge for the cup again until a man is found in England who can equal Mat Herreshoff in yacht building. Outer defenses of Cape Elizabeth were captured, to-day, by the navy, in mimic warfare. Six young men of Astoria are placed under arrest on suspicion of robbery. James McCall, the first white child born in Jacksonville, Or., died Monday.

SATURDAY AUG 29 The American Vice-Consul was not assassinated as reported. An attempt was made on his life, but the bullets missed him. The warships will continue on their voyage, as the situation in Turkey is critical. Caleb Powers, ex-secretary of the State of Kentucky, who was charged with complicity in a conspiracy to murder Gov. Goebel, in Jan. 1901, has been found guilty, and has received the death sentence. Yatch race was called off on account of heavy winds. A forest fire is sweeping over one of the heaviest timbered sections of Moose Lake country, Idaho.
