"When the catalogue comes from the mail-order house, draw an easy chair to the table, where the light will shine full on the page, and put your glasses on, so that no bargain will escape the eye. What a wonderful book it is, to be sure—wonderful for what it does not contain, as well as what it does. We miss some things we think would be of great benefit to their customers. Where is their offer to pay cash or exchange goods for your butter, eggs, corn, beans, hay or other produce? How much will they pay for your cattle, sheep or hogs, f. o. b., at your depot? How much tax will they pay to support your schools and educate your children, for improvement of roads and bridges, support of the poor of the county, for the expense of running the business of the township, county or State? On what page is their offer to contribute to the church? What line of credit will they extend to you when your crops are poor and money gone, when through illness or misfortune you are not able to send cash with the order for your groceries, clothing, etc? Where is their offer to contribute to your entertainments? What did they do to help you last week? In short will they do anything to provide a market for what you have to sell, and thereby help to keep up the value of your estate? Will they do anything for social, church, school or Government support, or do they take your dollar out of the community with no returns except the goods you buy? Answer all these questions fairly

and then ask yourself: Who is entitled to your business, the mail-order house or your home merchant? What will your answer be?—Kingsburg Recorder.
