Ordinance No. 76.

This is an ordinance entitled an ordinance to license, tax and regulate auctioneers, hawkers, peddlers, pawn-brokers, hotels, restaurants, boarding houses, stores, shops, mills, factories, livery and feed stables, theatres, public places of amusements and public entertainments. To license, tax, and regulate hacks, cabs, hackneys, carriages, wagons, carts, drays and other vehicles, and all classes of business or professions carried on or done within the corporation limits of the Town of Bandon and to fix rates therefor, and to repeal all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

The Town of Bandon Does Ordain as Follows:

SEC. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation to keep, conduct, operate or carry on for pay, either in person, by agent or representative, within the corporate limits of the Town of Bandon, any of the classes of business, trades, professions or occupations herein enumerated in this ordinance without first having obtained license therefor as hereinafter provided.

SEC. 2. The following classes of business, trades, occupations and professions shall be licensed, and any person or persons, firm or corporation carrying on the same either in person, by agent or representative, shall pay a monthly license therefor to the Town of Bandon, according to the following classifications:

All licenses for the classes of business, trades, professions or occupations enumerated in this section shall be issued by the Recorder of the Town of Bandon and shall expire on the first days of January, April, July and October of each year, and shall not be issued for a term of less than three months unless the person or persons, firm or corporation applying for same is entering into business more than ten days after the first day of January, April, July and October, in which event the license may be issued for a less term than three months (but not for less than one month), and any person, persons, firm or corporation engaged in any class of business, trades, professions or occupations enumerated in this section on or between the first and the tenth days of January, April, July and October of each year shall take out license as provided in this section on or before the tenth days of said months, for the term above mentioned.
SEC. 4. The following classes of business, trades, occupations, or professions shall be licensed, as follows, and any person, or persons, carrying on the same, either in person, by agent or by representative shall pay a license therefor to the Town of Bandon.
Agents: going from house to house soliciting, each Agent per day.....\$3.00
Auctioneers: each per day.....3.00
Exhibitions or Public entertainments (except for charitable, home talent, or benevolent purposes) each exhibition or entertainment from \$2.50 to \$10.00 in the discretion of the Recorder of the Town of Bandon.
Opticians: each per day.....\$3.00
Peddlers of goods, wares and merchandise: each per day.....3.00
All license for the classes of business, trades, professions or occupations enumerated in this section shall be issued by the Recorder of the Town of Bandon, for a period of not less than one day and such further time as the discretion of the Recorder shall seem meet and proper.
SEC. 5. Any person, persons, firm or corporation carrying on the classes of business, trades, professions or occupations enumerated in this ordinance shall pay license as herein provided on each variety or class of goods carried, handled, or kept for sale, provided that notions tobacco and cigars, where carried with other goods for which a license is paid shall be exempt from license, and general merchandise shall include all mercantile lines.
SEC. 6. It is hereby made the duty of the Recorder of the Town of Bandon to issue a license according to this ordinance to any person, persons, firm, or corporation for any of the classes of business, trades, professions or occupations enumerated in this ordinance, upon payment to him by such persons of the sum required to be paid therefor, the license so issued to enumerate the number of classes of business, trades, professions or occupations for which it is issued, and the price paid for each.
SEC. 7. It is hereby made the duty of the Recorder of the Town of Bandon, not later than five days before the first day of January, April, July and October, of each year, to deposit in the post office or hand to each person, persons, firm or corporation engaged in any class of business, trades, professions or occupations enumerated in this ordinance (for which a license is required to be paid) a notice printed in plain type, and to the effect that his or her license will be due on the first day of the following month, and that he or she must procure a license on or before the tenth day of said month and that no further notice will be given; provided that failure to receive said notice is not a bar to the payment of said license.
SEC. 8. Any person, persons, firm or corporation engaged in or carrying on for pay any of the classes of business, trades, professions or occupations, or keeping for pay or having for sale, any line or stock of goods mentioned in this ordinance for which a license is required to be paid without first having obtained license therefor, as required by this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court of the Town of Bandon shall be fined not less than \$5.00 and not more than \$100.00 and in default of said fine shall be imprisoned in the town jail not less than one nor more than twenty days, or both such fine and imprisonment. Provided further that a civil judgment may be taken against any person, persons, firm or corporation under such conviction for the amount thereof, in lieu of such fine and imprisonment and the costs, in the discretion of the court.
SEC. 9. It shall and is hereby made the duty of the Marshal of the Town of Bandon to enforce the provisions of this ordinance against any violation thereof. He may proceed against any person, persons, firm or corporation as provided in this ordinance upon their failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance.
SEC. 10. It shall be and is hereby made the duty of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Bandon 10 days prior to the first day of January, April, July and October of each year to fix and determine the class of each business, trade, profession or occupation within the Town of Bandon licensed by this ordinance, where such business, trades, professions or occupations are classified herein and by such time file with the Recorder of the Town of Bandon a written report, signed by the President of the Board of Trustees, designating the class to which each person, or persons, firm or corporation belongs, as provided by classification made in this ordinance.
SEC. 11. This ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force, on and after its approval by the President of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Bandon, and that ordinance No. 73, or parts of ordinances in connection with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
