Order of Washington.

The Order of Washington is now organized in our town and bids fair to become one of the flourishing lodges of Bandon, beginning with a membership of 31 beneficiaries, 4 social, and 12 applications. The members are very enthusiastic and think it is one among the best of the beneficiary lodges, and are highly pleased with the method of having a paid up policy at the end of the expectancy of life, which ranges from 10 to 25 years, according to age when admitted into the lodge. All who live to reach that age draw their own policy, but in case of death before that age is reached the beneficiary will draw the policy.

L. Perkins, physician; W. I. Stanberry, G.; G. G. Kennedy, S.; G. G. Edwards, E.; Mrs. Violet Hancock, Asst. E.; Mabel Jensen, Organist, and J. J. Edwards, Captain of the initiation corps. The meetings will be held in Concrete Hall on the first and third Tuesday nights.

Governor Vetoes.

The governor has vetoed H. B. 37, Eaton, appropriating \$250,000 for the maintenance of the University of Oregon. This bill failed to meet the approval of the executive, because he believes the amount is excessive and that the measure is extravagant, and does not specify what the money is to be used for.

On similar grounds the governor has withheld his approval of H. B. 180, Driscoll, increasing the salary of the auditor and his deputies in Multnomah county, another increase of staff fed officials.

Barred From Mails.

The president has asked the postmaster-general to take steps to bar from the mails newspapers printing the details of the Thaw trial if he can do so under the law.

The president has frequently, since the Thaw trial began, expressed himself forcibly on the question. He early ordered all attaches at the White House to watch carefully to prevent by all means any of his own children from getting hold of papers containing the details.

United States District Attorney Simpson sent warning to all New York newspapers that every publication which prints obscene matter concerning the Thaw case will be prosecuted under section 3893 of the federal statutes. Simpson acted independently of the president and did not know at the time of the latter's order.

The New Road.

Several newspapers in neighboring towns have again stopped work on the Drain-Coos Bay railroad. These papers have tried to knock this project, says the Drain Nonpareil, and hoped against hope that something might turn up to prevent the building of this road. Every month or so they "stop work" on the road, notwithstanding the fact that everything is being done that possibly can be done during the wet season. Work on the four tunnels between Drain and Scottsburg is being rushed with the utmost vigor, day and night, with three shifts of men, working from both ends. Tunnels 1 and 2, eleven and twelve miles west of Drain, each about 1200 feet long, are rapidly nearing completion and Right of Way Agent Nier informs us that they will be completed by April. The S. P. officials here simply laugh at the foolish predictions that this project will be abandoned, and say that as soon as spring opens up, an army of 3000 or 4000 men will be put to work and the new road rushed to completion. The new rails piled up here for this road are not being moved away, as reported in a Eugene paper, and the agents here deny that any such information has ever been sent out by them. That it is simply a plain case of "knocking."
