### His Opinion.

The following is from the pen of a visitor of Union, Oregon, written to the "Republican" of that place. This gives the impression of one man that has "come and seen." He doesn't have a very good word for the Coos Bay country, but cannot say anything against it.

"We got to the bar at Coos Bay long before noon Monday, and had to lay there until the tide was favorable. The boat didn't lay still—just circled around, and when the tide was right, they made a straight shoot. The bar wasn't rough, and we were soon in smooth water. There isn't anything very grand about the bay—just a nice sheet of water, lined on one side with a low sand ridge, and on the other with low banks covered with timber. To a person from Union, the towns look bad. They are built along the water front. The docks are built on piles. The business is on the first streets and the residences are back, some on steep hills and some on level places. Empire is the first place one touches; it is a dead place. North Bend is next; it is a pretty good town but isn't so large. Most of the mills are there. It seems to be the coming place. Real estate is so high it takes a rich person to buy anything. Plat B, that one hears about, is between North Bend and Marshfield. It lies along the east where there is a bluff. Some of it is level, some of it in timber and some of it cleared. It is high in price. Marshfield is the larger place. It is a pretty good town. While most of the work is at the Bend, it is likely there will be a string town all along the bay from North Bend to Marshfield.

Men are in big demand for common work, in logging camps and mills. Most men that come from a distance are speculators. Of course a good many will be fooled. All branches of business seem to have as many representatives as the business will stand.

Wednesday I went over on the Coquille river. One can't see much from the train. The fact is there isn't much to see but marsh land, and rough, good-for-nothing land. There are a few farms. To an East Oregonian they look insignificant, but the truth seems to be that they are a good investment, as the owners are nearly all in the dairy business, which pays well.

I went down to Bandon on a river steamer. It was a nice trip. There is a narrow strip all along that is good farming land. Along the river bank it is high, toward the hills it is low. Much of it is marsh land and not in cultivation. There are some ideal homes along the river.

Bandon is right on the coast. There is one street on the water front, where the business is. Many buildings are on piling. One can stand on the docks and see the breakers on the bar. Just back on the hill it is level. Most of the residences are there. The land lies well. Lots are from \$35 to \$1,500, owing to where they are. The cheap lots are back half a mile or so in heavy brush and small timber.

### Port Orford Notes.

A new pile driver is being built for use in repairing the wharf, and when it is completed it is said that work on the wharf will begin.

A prospector named Pitt, claims to have found valuable copper claims on Home's land and on J. G. Porterfield's timber claim on Lobster creek. But such finds are common in Curry.

Lorin Forty of Port Orford, though but 15 years old, is an expert rifle shot and has again been employed by R. D. Home at good wages, to shoot seals at the mouth of Rogue river in order to prevent their ravages on salmon and their poaching in the fishermen's nets.

Mr. Zahn of Los Angeles, a part owner in the Adolphsen mill, arrived here last Wednesday night. We are informed that the mill has a contract for two million feet of lumber to be delivered at the wharf here, and that the mill will start up in a few days if the weather does not remain too bad.

### Bags of Gold.

Bags of placer gold are being brought to the bank daily. The heavy rains and high water has made it possible to reach the rich ground, and good returns result. From the Black Channel mine on Foot creek \$1,000 was brought in from a small clean-up. It is estimated by H. B. Nye that the production of this property alone this year will reach the \$10,000 mark.

D. P. Blee has just completed working over 500 yards of dirt for prospecting purposes in connection with the installing of the electric shovel to be brought from the east by Lesley & Hough, and cleaned up over \$900. At other points on Kanes creek, good money is being taken out and unusual activity is reported from Foots and Sardines creeks.

It is reported that more placer gold dust will be produced in this section this spring than for years past.—Gold Hill News.

### Weather Report.

November, December and January were unusually stormy, and floods and washouts were of frequent occurrence. The only noteworthy cold spell was from January 5th to January 19th, when the lowest temperature of the season occurred. They ranged from 12° to 29° in the coast counties; from 7° to 13° in the Willamette valley; from 17° to 20° in southern Oregon; from 4° below to 8° below zero in the Columbia River valley, and from 2° below zero to 20° below zero in the Plateau section of the State. This cold spell was preceded by good falls of snow in the eastern sections of the State, and the ground was generally well covered during the time of freezing temperatures. Heavy ice formed in the Columbia River during this cold spell, and navigation between Portland and the Dalles was suspended for a month, and it was interrupted at times between Portland and Astoria. A severe ice storm, or "silver thaw," occurred in the upper end of the Willamette valley on January 28th and 29th. This storm caused immense damage to trees, shrubbery, and electric wires in the city of Portland and the adjoining territory. March was featureless, except that the rainfall in the southern half of the State was about an inch in excess of the normal.
