The keeper struck it with an iron bar, and it charged into the crowd where it sank its fangs into the neck of a 4-year-old child of Mrs. E. Z. Rozell.

J. W. Bell, a Twin Falls blacksmith, drew a revolver and opened fire, killing the animal after half a dozen shots.—Spokesman.
