Hobo Must Go.

Harriman, Hill and other big railroad chiefs have entered into an agreement with the National Conference of Charities and Corrections to secure a National Commission of Vagrancy. The plan is to clear all railroads and small towns of huns, hoboes and vags generally, force them to be sanitary, to earn their living and lodging or to disappear altogether from districts where the strong arm of the commission can reach them.

It is estimated that hoboes cost the railroads annually 2,500,000. They infest the yards, set fire to cars, throw switches out of malice, assault towermen and switchmen, break signals and cause disastrous wrecks with appalling loss of life and property. Recently they have taken to traveling in such numbers that they can terrorize the trainman. A majority of them are "yeggs" and carry nitroglycerine for the purpose of blowing safes and locks. Occasionally a "yegg" meets with an accident and he and his glycerine blow up. Then there is a wreck and nobody knows what caused it.

Sunset City Excursion.

The excursion of the 23rd certainly left the towns of the Bay sadly depopulated at least temporarily. Many hundreds took advantage of the ideal day, the cheap rates, to have a day off. The ball game that was to have been played with Coquille at the latter place was because of the excursion changed to be played at this place and that also brought, in addition to the regular excursion, a large number of the Coquille and Myrtle Point fans.

The channel will have a height of 17 feet, will flow daily 800,000,000 gallons. The system is planned to be completed in 1930, and is estimated to cost \$162,000,000.
