A. P. Huson, who was recently appointed state deputy fire warden for King County, Wash., with headquarters at Seattle, has filed his commission and assumed his duties.

He is touring the country and posting notices warning all persons from leaving lighted campfires or burning slashing without permits. Logging companies will be required to place spark arresters on stacks of logging

engines and locomotives used on the logging roads. The steam railroad engines will be equipped with spark arresters so as to minimize the danger of starting a forest fire by flying sparks. Permits to burn slashings and waste wood will be issued from the office of the fire warden.

From authentic data compiled by shipping firms it is ascertained there are about forty two new steamers, either under constructions, contracts awarded for building or coming around the Horn designed for the purpose of transporting lumber, coastwise, at the present time. The combined carrying capacity of this fleet, if built, is estimated at about 70,000,000 feet per month. It is not likely that all the contracts in the hands of the builders will be completed, as probably several orders will be canceled, but even if only half this number of vessels is added to the carrying fleet in 1907, it will certainly be a factor in keeping down coastwise charter rates for some time to come. A new steamer can pay expenses and yield a small return on the investment in carrying lumber at \$5.00 per M feet. But this figure will not leave a margin sufficiently large to pay for any repairs. With a freight rate of \$6.00 it is estimated a steam schooner, barring accidents, will pay a dividend of about 25 per cent, which, taking the nature of the hazard into consideration, is certainly not excessive.

While the movement of lumber products during the last month has fallen off as usual during the mid-summer season, the outlook is considered altogether hopeful. Despite the aggravating car shortage early in the season, the Inland Empire mills marketed practically the same amount of lumber during the first five months of the year, as they marketed during the same period in 1906. Another peculiar feature of the situation is, although the milling capacity of the Inland Empire has been considerably increased and the movement of lumber has shown practically no gain, the stocks on hand are believed to be considerably below normal. This is attributed to the fact that many of the small mills with limited capital have been compelled to curtail some of the large plants to run days only instead of night and day, as in former seasons.

The demand in local territory promises to continue to be heavy throughout the balance of the season, and no uneasiness is felt about the ability to market all the stock that can be obtained under existing conditions. Values hold firmer than customary at this season of the year,
