Coquille Notes.

From the Sentinel.

Wednesday evening at 8:30 o'clock occurred the marriage of Mr. M. J. Hartson and Miss Edna Lorenz at the home of the bride's parents in this city. Rev. Branham officiating. The ring ceremony was used, which was very beautiful and impressive. Master Fred Lorenz, nephew of the bride, acted as ring bearer, and the little misses Marjorie and Camilla Lorenz, neices of the bride, were flower girls. The house was decorated with Oregon grape and the ceremony took place under the wedding bell. The bride is the youngest daughter of our highly esteemed pioneer residents, Mr. and Mrs. N. Lorenz, and is a young lady of high culture and social attainments and is greatly admired by her large circle of friends. The groom, M. J. Hartson, is manager of the Coquille Creamery and has been a resident of this city about three years. He has a large number of friends who rejoice with him.

The city council held a special meeting Monday evening at which several matters were talked over, but no action was taken except to order the re-advertising for bids for the planking of B street. The council accepted the liquor bonds of E. A. Beckett, also the bonds of R. S. Knowlton as city treasurer. The regular meeting of the council will be held next Monday evening.

We learn by private letter from Washington that Hon. Binger Hermann has not forgotten worthy old soldiers who reside in Coos county. He has succeeded in getting the following pensions raised for worthy citizens of this section: Harry H. Baldwin of Bandon raised from \$144 a year to \$200, and Judge Lowe of Bandon, a Mexican war veteran now gets \$20 a month. When Dr. Hermann came to Oregon in 1858 he purchased the old homestead of H. H. Baldwin, and Judge Lowe was one of the first to settle with his family in this valley. Binger Hermann was not in his majority at that time, and now after a half century he has the pleasure of obtaining recognition by the government of those aged defenders of their country, J. J. Endicott of Myrtle Point, and J. H. Aker of this city were also remembered. The old soldiers will miss Mr. Hermann's good work for his constituents.

The Committee in charge have decided to have the Southwestern Oregon G. A. R. encampment in August on 28th, 29th, 30th, and the last day has been set apart as pioneer day. Col. Rosa is now President of the Pioneer Association, and a member of the G. A. R. Society, therefore it is supposed that the arrangement is satisfactory with all. It was decided at the meetings of both organizations last year that the reunions should be held at the same time at Bandon. In former years the veterans and the early settlers met together, and had most excellent social intercourse, and they look back now to those festivals with much pleasure, and it is believed that the coming reunion will be greatly enjoyed. It is very fitting for the pioneers to relax from their labors and get together for a social meet, where they can bring back to memory the days of long ago, when the red man and the wild animals were just surrounding the wilderness to civilization. There is no more fitting place than Bandon for the festivities, and the good people of that place have always given royal receptions to the gray haired veterans as well as to those who first blazed the trails of the country and their followers.

Johnson for President.

Henry Watterson's secret is out. This story is told in a Washington dispatch to the New York World: "Governor John A. Johnson, of Minnesota, is the candidate to whom I referred as capable of carrying the democratic party to victory next year," said Henry Watterson, according to Colonel Charles A. Edwards, secretary of the democratic congressional committee, who re-

turned today from Louisville. "I had a conference with 'Marse' Henry," Colonel Edwards said, "and he went over the ground at length. Colonel Watterson, you will remember, some time ago stated that at the proper time he would name a democrat living north of Mason and Dixon's line and west of the Alleghany mountains, who never has been beaten for public office, and who wears a mustache, and who, if nominated, could lead the democratic party to victory. Immediately guesses were made as to the identity of Colonel Watterson's man. Some one finally hit on Governor Johnson, but it was found that Johnson wears no mustache, and so he was dropped from the guessing. It became known later that Johnson wore a mustache up to the time he became governor since which time he has gone clean shaven. Colonel Watterson asserted that Governor Johnson was the one democrat who was absolutely available, against whom no faction in the party entertains animosity, who has a record of carrying a strongly republican state twice, and who is at this time before the nation without a flaw of any sort."
