

Building in Bandon.

We glean the following from a recent issue of the Times that will give our readers an idea of the amount of building either in course of completion, or finished or to commence building shortly:

According to figures submitted by A. D. Morse, manager of the Bandon Investment Corporation, the following constructions are under way in Bandon: 3 story addition to Gallier House, 35x100, Gallier Bros; 2 story building to be used as saloon, corner First and Wharf streets, 20x40, Geo. P. Laird; addition to Canning building 20x10, C. Timmons; 2 story building on First street to be used as livery barn, 40x130, Hoyt and Garoutte; store building on Atwater street, 20x50, Mrs. McDuffee; store building on Wharf street 28x50, Baker & Hoover; 2 story building on First street, 100x30, Panter Bros; 2 story office building, First street, 44x40, Geo. P. Laird; Slaughter House, Woodland Add.; Robinson & Wright; Power House, Bandon Light & Power Co., 50x40; Cody Mill, capacity 100,000 feet; Lyons & Johnson Mill, capacity 50,000 feet; Price Ship Yard; Residence building, 10 rooms on Atwater street, Capt. Panter; 6 room residence, Azalea Park, Professor Ostein; two five room cottages, West Bandon, W. A. Kennedy; four room cottage in Plat A., E. C. Gilbert; four room cottage, West Bandon, R. W. Boyle; five room cottage in West Bandon, Geo. Hite; eight room residence, East Bandon, Phillipot; five room cottage, Azalea Park, Geo. Cody; six room residence, O'Neill's Add., J. J. O'Neill; four room cottage Old Bandon, J. Denholm; three room cottage, Portland Add., C. L. Law; four room cottage, Port Add., L. Nelson; three room cottage, Port Add., C. King; six room cottage, Port Add., Walter Laird; three room cottage, Port Add., R. Panter; two cottages, Woodlawn Add., H. G. Gerkin; two six room and one five room cottages, Woodlawn Add., J. E. Plans for the following are being prepared: 50-room hotel to be built in Woodland addition by George Montgomery. It will be elegantly furnished and run on the European plan.

Building 100x40 to be built by Geo. P. Laird under contract to the Bandon Athletic Club for gymnasium purposes on Atwater street.

Lumber orders for 20 new residences are in at the various mills; but the local supply at present is inadequate.

Anglers Meet.

If the Gold Hill Chamber of Commerce can get the Izaak Walton of the state together September 1st, an Oregon Anglers' Association will be formed. Secretary R. C. Kesley, of the Chamber, has invited all the fishermen of the state to Gold Hill for that date and the following day, when fly casting contests will be held.

Gold Hill is on the Rogue River, one of the most noted on the Pacific Coast for trout and game fishing, and is chosen as the most suitable place for a meeting of this kind.

Governor George E. Chamberlain will be there, and H. G. Van Dusen, Master Fish Warden of Oregon; J. W. Baker, State Game Warden; H. L. Kelly, Jr., Superintendent United States Fish Hatchery, Trail, Or.; R. D. Hume, Wedderburn, Or.

Subjects that will be considered are: "Obstructions in Streams," "Fishways," "Net Fishing," "Fish Hatcheries," "Stocking of Streams," "Game Fish."

Governor Chamberlain has ap-

pointed a committee of seven to consider the conditions at several points along the Rogue River. This committee will meet with the Governor for the first time at Gold Hill.

Two delegates may be sent from each Angler's Association or Rod and Gun Club, one from each commercial body, one from each city and he may represent each County.

Myrtle Point Notes.

Mr. Henry G. Hermann and Miss Sarah M. Miller were united in marriage at the home of the bride's mother, Mrs. Conrad Miller, on the South Fork, six miles south of Myrtle Point on Sunday, September 1st, Rev Thomas Barklow officiating.

The groom is the second son of Mr. and Mrs. T. M. Hermann and is engaged in the blacksmithing business in Myrtle Point, being associated with E. E. Bender. The bride is the eldest daughter of Mrs. Conrad Miller. Both were born and raised in this section of the country and have won many friends.

Reports from Drain state that here are 200 men working on the grade of the Drain Coos Bay extension of the Southern Pacific within six miles of Drain, and that the work of construction is being carried westward from Drain for a distance of 15 to 20 miles. The work is under the direction of A. J. Barclay, one of Chief Engineer Hood's assistants. There is nothing doing in the work of constructing tunnels although sub-contractors have their camps established at tunnels 1, 2 and 3, awaiting action by the Southern Pacific company.

The little seven year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Wm Norton of the Middle Fork is glad that mankind in general and himself in particular, was constructed with ribs, else he might not be alive today.

On Wednesday of this week he was walking along the road up the river, carrying a pail of milk when he was struck by a bullet that came from he knew not where. The blow knocked him down and when he got up he saw a man across the river and thinks it likely that the man fired the shot. The little fellow was brought to town and the doctors found that he had sustained only a flesh wound. The bullet evidently of 22-caliber, entered his side near the heart, was deflected by one of his ribs and circled around his body under the skin finding exit at the back. Under favorable conditions the little fellow is expected to make a rapid recovery from his wound.

The water in the Coquille river is so low that the Echo is now compelled to stop at Arago. The freight and mail are taken down by team to meet the boat.

School will begin a week from Monday at which time it is hoped to have everything in readiness so teachers and pupils may enter a successful school year. The new compulsory education law, adopted by the last legislature, requires the attendance of pupils of school age throughout the year and provides strict punishment for those who do not comply with the law.
