John Unican and family, who for some weeks have been visiting in Smith River, Cal., returned to Port Orford last Friday, having fallen in love with Smith River Valley, which is one of the finest valleys facing the Pacific ocean anywhere. Miss Silvia Clarno returned with them, having spent a couple of months visiting with her father at Pistol River.

The Commissioner of the General Land Office has issued an order which requires the registers and receivers of the United States Land Offices to prepare all applications to make entries and filings on public lands when they are requested to do so by the applicant. This order will insure greater accuracy in papers of this kind, and be a saving to the applicants who have heretofore been required to have applications prepared at their own expense.

Asher H. Moore, a pioneer of Southern Oregon, and for half a century a resident of Curry county, died at Gold Beach on Tuesday, Oct. 1, 1907, aged 71 years on the 12th of last March. In early days Mr. Moore ran a pack train from Crescent City to Waldo and Kirbyville, and took part in the Indian wars of that section and was in the battle of Hungry Hill. He afterwards married Miss Charlotte Morrison, at the mouth of Rogue river, and settled in that vicinity where he was universally respected, and was once elected Sheriff. The deceased was a natural mechanic and civil engineer, and in his busy life did more than his allotted share of hard work. His was a useful life, and now that the tired body is at rest and the busy hands folded on his peaceful bosom—perhaps it is better so.

The new freight boat built by Ed Ellingston for J. R. Miller of Port Orford, and which is to ply between Coos Bay, Bandon and Port Orford, was launched from the yard above Coquille yesterday at noon. She is a trim and substantial craft, supplied with strong machinery.

We learn from the proceedings of the Methodist conference held in Portland that Rev. W. S. Gordon has been assigned to the Coquille-Bandon circuit for the ensuing year. Also we note that Rev. G. W. Ellis, late of this pastorate, is assigned to Springfield, Lane County.

The Baudon was only recently launched and fitted for the Coquille trade, being modeled with especial adaptness to the bar of this stream. Her commander is Capt. J. P. Jensen who for a long time was on the bridge of the Elizabeth, running into the river.

Myrtle Point Notes.

An automobile line to carry passengers between Florence and Marshfield, is being installed by Portland men. A seven-passenger Buick will be the first car used, and later two other and larger cars will be placed on the run.

Mayor M. O. Stemmler last week registered in with probably the biggest pair of elk horns of the season; anyway he is waiting to be shown a larger pair. His prize was an animal as large as a horse. The horns had eleven prongs on one side and nine on the other. Mr. Stemmler succeeded in saving the head and neck covering of the animal, and when mounted he will have a rare trophy.

Contractor J. D. Bennett has a large amount of material on hand for the construction of the new bridge across the North Fork at the mill, and a number of workmen are encamped at the site with their families. Two pile drivers are on the job, and several of the piles have been driven to place. Work will be hurried to get the new bridge ready for use this winter. The new structure will be to the east of the present bridge, about on the site of the former bridge.

The first convention of Rebekah district No. 18 was held at Coquille Wednesday, with representatives of that order present from all the towns of Coos county. Mrs. Galloway of McMinnville, President of the State Assembly was present. The local lodge served a fine luncheon at noon and the session was formally opened at 2:30, with Mrs. Dubner of Marshfield as chairman, and Mrs. Chase of Coquille as secretary. Mrs. Lawrence of Coquille made the opening address of welcome, and Mrs. Adams of this city responded. Marshfield was chosen as the place for the next convention. Mrs. Owens of Marshfield being chosen as chairman, and Mrs. Robinson of Coquille secretary. In the evening the local lodge exemplified the work, and afterwards punch and cake were served.

Without Pay or Thanks.

In a recent address United States Senator David Davis sang praises concerning newspapers and it is safe to say that it will not be soon forgotten by the pencil pushers. He said: "Every year every local paper gives from 5,000 to 50,000 free lines for the benefit of the community in which it is located. At fair advertising rates 10 cents a line, this means \$500 to \$5,000. No other agency can or will do this. The editor, in proportion to his means, does more for his home town than any other man. He ought to be supported, not because you happen to like him or admire his writing, but because a local paper is the best investment a community can make. It may not be crowded with great thought, but financially it is of more benefit than both preacher and teacher. Today editors do more for less pay than any men on earth. Patronize your home paper, not as a charity but as an investment."

New Bulletin.

A new bulletin of postoffice rules has been issued from the office of Postmaster General Von Meyer. One rule that will be of interest to a great many people is the saving deposit feature, which is absolutely safe, with the government backing. This provides that domestic money orders may be drawn, payable to the purchaser at the office of issue, or at any other money order office, and be retained as savings, but purchasers should present the order for payment within seven years of date of issue. This is along the idea

of the post master general of establishing postal savings banks which he is to recommend to the next congress. He will also recommend the establishment of the parcels post, which is likely to be opposed by the express companies and the country merchants, while the bankers are quite likely to be a unit against the postal savings scheme. He will also recommend the reduction of the first-class rate between this and a number of foreign countries, will approve the establishment of stamp-vending machines and ask the revival of the postal note, along with other reforms and additions to the service. The new rules provide that domestic money orders may be exchanged for warrants on the U. S. treasurer at the expiration of a year, by application to the postmaster. Another thing not generally known is that registered packages to the amount of \$25 are insured against loss in the mails.
