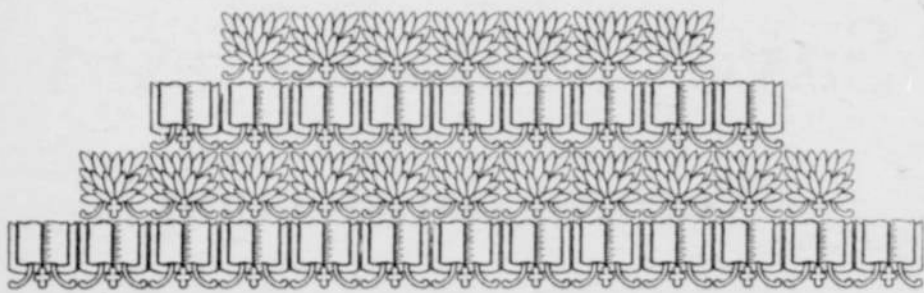

### Oregon Development League.

[Special Correspondence]

The Hawaiian girls, chaperoned by Mrs. Edyth Tozier Weathered, are still in Portland and express themselves as delighted with Oregon.

A big delegation from Portland will go to the Dalles to attend both the Fair and the meeting of the Open River Association Wednesday the 9th.

Lecturers throughout the East are demanding slides showing views of Oregon.

Mr. W. B. Glatke, a member of the Board of Governors of the Portland Commercial Club, has put before the Club some intensely interesting figures on the poultry and egg business, for general circulation throughout the State. One hundred carloads of eggs alone were shipped into the State of Oregon during the past twelve months. These would average the year around, \$2600,00 per car. Oregon growers supply the chief demand for turkeys, ducks, geese, and chickens, but four times the present production would find a ready home market, while in eggs we might multiply by ten and still the prices would pay as well as any product grown either on the farm or in the orchard.

The La Grande Commercial Club has taken advantage of the fact that the passenger trains stop there from ten to fifteen minutes while changing engines, baggage, etc., and have erected an exhibit building, and before the trains reach the depot an announcement is made that all who desire to do so can get off and look through the exhibit hall. A lecture is delivered to the passengers. Twice a week the ladies distribute flowers to each and every passenger and place beautiful bouquets on each table in the dining car, accompanied by a card "Compliments of La Grande." On some occasions they have distributed prunes to every passenger, and placed prune jelly on each table in the dining car, accompanied by cards bearing: "Compliments of La Grande." Made from Grande Ronde prunes, with Grande Ronde sugar." Distribution of apples are to be made to the passengers. This is a substantial character of advertising that cannot help but bring results.

### Engines of Destruction.

Strange things are happening on the sea.

Germany has a new torpedo boat that has attained a speed of almost thirty-four knots—which is about thirty-nine land miles—an hour.

Not many years ago a locomotive that could maintain a speed of thirty-five miles an hour was regarded as a marvel.

But here is a war vessel that preps itself through the sea almost at the speed of a bird's flight, pushing aside hundreds of thousands of tons of water, while carrying in its iron jaws the most modern implements of destruction.

The Davenport and Portsmouth dockyards, England, have two larger and more formidable Dreadnaughts in process of construction. They will carry 13.5 inch guns instead of 12-inch.

### Needless Worrying.

The Los Angeles Times, still grieving over the terrible plight of Oregon under its "revolution" constitution has picked up a few facts and along therewith a lot of misinformation from "a former Oregon journalist" whose name is not disclosed. The story, boiled down, is that the direct legislation amendment to the constitution was brought about by a coalition of the labor union, the "silver Republicans," the Populists and the Democrats, handled by "an unknown crank of insignificant personality," and Mr. —now Senator— Bourne, the real purpose being to defeat Senator Mitchell—back in 1895.

This shows dense ignorance of re-

cent Oregon political history. This "Oregon journalist" must have been quite "former." The fight against Mitchell occurred long before the enactment of this "revolutionary" law. It was adopted after "silver Republicans" and Populists had ceased to exist as such, and the Democrats hadn't enough members of the legislature to be worth noticing. The people adopted it, by a vote of two to one, and it was supported by a large number of the most enlightened and conservative prominent men of the state, including both Republicans and Democrats. The ringleading Republicans were no doubt against it but did not dare openly oppose it.

This new feature of the Oregon constitution may be "revolutionary," but the people of Oregon prefer it to being "dumb, driven cattle" under the arbitrary orders of a politico-railroad boss like Herrin, as California voters are.
