Notice of Street Improvement.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Bandon, County of Coos, State of Oregon, by order duly passed on the 6th day of December, 1907, which order is entered in the Journal of Proceedings of the said Board for that day, does propose to improve First Street within the Woolen Mill Addition to the Town of Bandon, County and State aforesaid, for the entire width of said Street, beginning at the East line of intersection of said Street with Pacific Avenue (otherwise known as Little Street) and continuing Eastward, three blocks to the East line of Broadway Avenue, (otherwise known as the East boundary line of the Town of Bandon) said improvement to be made by establishing an official grade thereon by a survey, and also to make cuts and fills in said street to conform to and in accordance with such grade and survey so proposed to be established.
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that unless two-thirds of the property owners of and upon said street file a written remonstrance with the Recorder of the said Town of Bandon within ten (10) days from the final publication of this notice, which final notice will be upon Thursday, the 25th day of December, 1907, remonstrating against the proposed improvement, then an ordinance will be passed by the said Board of Trustees, appropriating funds for such survey, grade and improvement, WHICH ORDINANCE WILL FURTHER PROVIDE, that the fund so appropriated will be raised by levying an assessment upon the lots or tracts of land abutting upon the street so proposed to be improved, which assessment will be made according to the amount of excavation or fill to be made in front of each lot or tract from any open said street, and the ordinance will further provide for carrying out the proposed improvement according to law.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Bandon, County of Coos, State of Oregon, by order duly passed on the 14th day of December, 1907, which order is entered in the Journal of the Proceedings of the said Board for that day, does propose to improve Homer Street within the said Town of Bandon, County and State aforesaid for the entire width of the said street, beginning at the North line of its intersection with Atwater street, (otherwise known as the Extension of First Street) and from said intersection continuing Northward to a line even with the North end of the Woolen Mill, said improvement to be made by setting planks, placing necessary stringers, capping and 4 inch plank, and also by building an 8 foot sidewalk on each side thereof, and planking the same with 2 inch lumber, and constructing necessary railing.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that unless two-thirds of the property owners of and upon said street file a written remonstrance against such improvements with the recorder of said Town, within ten (10) days from the final publication of this notice, which final publication will be upon Thursday, the 2nd day of January, 1908, then an Ordinance will be passed by the said Board of Trustees, appropriating funds for such improvements, WHICH ORDINANCE WILL FURTHER PROVIDE that all of the funds so appropriated will be raised by levying an assessment upon the lots abutting upon the said Street so proposed to be improved, which assessment will be apportioned upon the respective lots according to the frontage thereof upon such street, and the ordinance will further provide for carrying out such improvements, and for the collection of such assessment according to law.
