From the Sentinel.

The train from Marshfield came over from there Monday the first time for a week.

It is reported that only a few straggling logs went over the bar during the late high water.

Last Saturday, Dec. 28, Bert Seal of this city picked strawberries from his vines. The berries were large and well formed and only needed a few warm days to ripen them. L. J. Young took a photograph of them.

James W. Mast of Bandon was in Coquille Monday attending the annual meeting of the Fat Elk Drainage District.

Candidates for offices at the June election can obtain the necessary blanks at the county clerk's office. The new primary law makes it obligatory that all candidates file an affidavit before running for office.

Misses Nettie Carey and Kittie Thom arrived yesterday from Eureka, Cal., where they are taking a training course in a hospital, the former going to Bandon and the latter to Myrtle Point to visit their parents.

Word has been received of the marriage of Mrs. H. T. Wootten, a former teacher of this county, to Mr. Geo. W. Wetsell, which took place at St. Louis, Mo. Oct. 17. They are making their home at Adair, Ill. Mrs. Wootten taught in the public schools at the Point. Coquille and Bandon and resigned her position here about two years ago.

Myrtle Point Notes.

From the Enterprise.

A large number of Coquille Valley fruitgrowers met at Myrtle Point for the purpose of forming an association. A motion prevailed unanimously that the meeting proceed with the organization of the "Co-

quille Valley Fruit-growers' Association," to be incorporated under the laws of Oregon with Myrtle Point as the principal place of business. The value of the shares was placed at \$2.50 each; and it was decided that the regular meetings should be on the first Wednesday of each month. A committee of five on incorporation and promotion was chosen, selection being as follows: Price Robison, L. A. Roberts, E. Arneson, D. A. Huling and L. C. Bargelt. The secretary was requested to invite all the fruit-growers of the county to affiliate with the new association, and give their best help toward making the organization a success. Dr. K. A. Leep was selected as a delegate to represent the association at the Marshfield meeting Friday.

Mr. James Button and Miss Myrtle Mullen were united in marriage Wednesday evening, the 1st, at the Myrtle Point hotel, Rev. Thomas Barklow officiating.

The North Bend Harbor is claiming a population of 3,130 on the showing that there are 628 children of school age in that district as evidenced by the last census.

It is estimated that there are 20,000 logs in a jam on the North Fork between Gravel Ford and the Fox bridge. The jam will not be broken until it is certain that there is sufficient boom room on the lower river to hold them when they are released. The logs come from several camps along the river, J. M. McDonald being a large owner.

The train managed to get through from Marshfield Tuesday morning for the first time since a week ago last Saturday, the interruption of the service being due to the high water of the Coquille river. The track was softened in places, but a few loads of gravel sufficed to repair it.
