Notice of Street Improvement.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Bandon, County of Coos, State of Oregon, by order duly passed on the 10th day of January, 1908, which order is entered in the Journal of the Proceedings of the said Board for that day, does propose to improve and repair certain portions of Avator Street, and to improve certain portions of First and Spruce streets in the manner as follows:

To improve and repair Avator street, as so much thereof as is contained between the intersection with the middle line of Pacific and of Columbia streets, and to provide for a central gutter, curbs, curbing and drainage conduits for an eighteen foot width, which to be a continuation of and in all respects similar to the new Avator Street Bridge, the repairs to be done to consist of four-inch white cedar plankings which repair the Board of Trustees will provide by Ordinance to be paid for out of the general fund of the Town of Bandon, but the improvements therein to be paid for by assessment, as hereinafter provided.

The said Board also proposes to improve First and Spruce streets in the manner following: Beginning at the end line of the lot occupied by the Town Hall on First street, to improve the said streets as follows: To improve the said streets, curbing and drainage conduits for an eighteen foot width, which to be a continuation of and in all respects similar to the new Avator Street Bridge, the repairs to be done to consist of four-inch white cedar plankings which repair the Board of Trustees will provide by Ordinance to be paid for out of the general fund of the Town of Bandon, but the improvements therein to be paid for by assessment, as hereinafter provided.

Further provided that the planking of the intersection of said First and Spruce streets shall be paid for out of the general fund of the said Town of Bandon.
