Bond for \$40,000.

In favor of, 127; opposed, 8.

The above figures record the action taken by the North Bend people Saturday on the proposition to bond the city for \$40,000 to enable the building of a school house of adequate capacity to meet the heavy demands of a rapidly growing community. The overwhelming majority demonstrates more forcible than words the civic spirit of progressiveness and aggressiveness which has placed Marshfield's sister city in her present rank. It was also voted at Saturday's election to sell the bonds to the highest bidder. Attorney Maybee, of North Bend, superintended the drawing up of the bonding proposition. It is the intention to let the bonds out at five per cent. interest.—Times.

Notice of Street Improvement.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Bandon, County of Coos, State of Oregon, by order duly passed on the 10th day of January, 1908, which order is entered in the Journal of the Proceedings of the said Board for that day, does propose to improve and repair certain portions of Atwater Street, and to improve a certain portion of First and Spruce streets in the manner as follows:

To improve and to repair Atwater street, or so much thereof as is contained between its intersection with the middle lines of Pacific and of Columbia avenues, said improvement to consist of piling, benches, curbing and stringers sufficient for an eighteen foot bridge, which bridge shall be a continuation of and in all respects similar to the new Atwater Street bridge; the repairs thereon to consist of four-inch white cedar planking, which repair the Board of Trustees will provide by Ordinance to be paid for out of the general fund of the Town of Bandon, but the improvements thereon to be paid for by assessment, as hereinafter provided.

The said Board also proposes to improve First and Spruce streets in the manner following: Beginning at the west line of the lot occupied by the Town Hall on First street, to improve the said street westward therefrom, for the entire width thereof, to the west line of intersection with Spruce street; and to improve Spruce street from the south line of its intersection with First street, for the entire width thereof, southward to the north line of intersection with Third street, said improvement to consist of covering said streets with planking where the same is below grade and cannot be converted, and of making the proper excavations and fills where necessary, and to build an eight-foot sidewalk upon both sides of said portions of First and Spruce streets, where such walk shall not already have been built. Further proposed to make and establish an official grade of and upon all portions of said streets above mentioned.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that unless two-thirds of the property owners upon said portion of Atwater street, or those upon said portions of First and Spruce streets file a written remonstrance against such improvements with the Recorder of said Town, within Ten (10) days from the final publication of this notice, which final publication will be upon Thursday, the 30th day of January, 1908, then an Ordinance will be passed by the said Board of Trustees establishing the grade upon Atwater street, and also appropriating funds for so much thereof as shall be deemed an improvement, as above specified, and the said Board will also pass an Ordinance establishing the grade of and upon said portions of First and Spruce streets, and for raising funds by assessment for all of the work thereon, all of which work will be declared by Ordinance to be an improvement, both of which Ordinances will provide that all funds so proposed to be raised shall be by assessment except as above provided, which assessment shall be levied upon the abutting lots or tracts of land in proportion to the frontage thereof upon said streets, which Ordinance will further provide for the collection of such assessments, and make any and all other provisions necessary to carry the same into full force and effect according to law.

Further provided that the planking of the intersection of said First and Spruce streets shall be paid for out of the general fund of the said Town of Bandon.
