Notice is hereby given that the Board of Frustees of the Town of Bandon, County of Coos, State of Oregon, by order duly passed on the 10th day of January, 1998, which order is entered in the Journal of the Pro-ceedings of the said Board for that day, does propose to improve and repair certain portions of Atwater Street, and to improve certain portion of First and Spruce streets n the manner as follows:

To improve and to repair Atwater street, isin't his fortune, but a good or so much thereof as is contained between its intersection with the middle lines of Pacific and of Columbia avenues, said improvement to consist of piling, bents, capping and stringers sufficient for an eighteen foot bridge, which bridge shall be a contin-uation of and in all respects similar to the new Atwater Street Bridge; the repairs thereon to consist of four-inch white cedar planking, which repair the Board of Trustees will provide by Ordinance to be paid for out of the general fund of the Town of HARRY MORRISON, Bandon, but the improvements thereon to be paid for by assessment, as hereinafter
