### Coquille Notes.

Circuit court convenes April 26. Hon. W. C. Chase has filed his petition with the county clerk as a candidate for joint senator from Coos and Curry.

The Sentinel was informed last week that Fish Warden Van Dusen was in Coos county for the purpose of installing a hatchery on Coquille river.

Deputy Sheriff Gage and his force of clerks are busy collecting taxes, which are coming in at a rapid rate. Part of the force are working until 10 o'clock every night in clearing up the day's work.

The petitions filed since the last issue of the Sentinel are those of H. E. Wilcox of McKinley and J. A. Davenport of this city for county commissioner; N. C. Medley for assessor, and A. M. Snyder of Myrtle Point and E. Heuckendorf of Prosper for sheriff.

E. A. McDuffee and Claude and Paul Ford have commenced painting the steamer Dispatch which is moored just below the city wharf. This is quite a task, and will require about two weeks' time to complete. They have also taken the contract to repaint the O. K. creamery which they are now priming.

Wednesday morning while Geo. Belloni and Geo. Goodrich were under the saw mill in this city repairing the conveyor, the clothes of Mr. Goodrich in some manner became entangled in the main shaft and was wound up before the machine could be stopped. He was cut loose and carried into the mill store where Dr. Culin was called and dressed his wounds, and he was conveyed to the Western Oregon general hospital where at the present time he is resting easier. His injuries consisted of five broken ribs and he was bruised considerably.
