Mr. Sentinel, we desire to administer a brotherly rebuke for the editorial in which a United States Senator from Oregon is called trifling, undignified and unmerited names. Think it over.

The launching of the Daisy will mark an epoch in the many successes of Bandon enterprise and we should observe the event with more than ordinary attention. By all means let us have the holiday.

The attitude of the city fathers in "trying again" is to be commended, and if those who opposed the last attempt to incorporate the city, will lend their active aid, the work of the committee on revision of charter should be of a nature acceptable to all.

WHETHER candidates support Statement I or oppose it we want to see them state the fact and present a bold stand. We have too many shyster politicians who hope that their attitude on questions of vital importance will never be questioned. If you are in favor of the statement, say so. If you are against it say so and in both instances give us a little reasoning on the matter. Try to enlighten the public a little and to mold public opinion, instead of merely following the trend of what you think is the opinion of a more or less uninformed majority.

THE impression has gone out among the other cities of Coos that Bandonians are loath to enter a team of baseball players in a new league, unless we shall have the privilege of importing players. Nothing can be more erroneous than such an idea. Bandon has a tradition of good baseball in the pages of her history, and her sons are bred to the game. We have plenty of talent in Bandon and can turn out a team of home production that ought to compete with any in the county. It is to be hoped that some one will take hold and organize a team in this city. We would all rather see our home boys play ball than to watch a team of foreigners contend for us.

BANDON will have a new paper shortly. Mr. Scotton who resigned from the force of the Recorder some little time ago, is the leading spirit in the venture and will handle the quill in the front office. He has already sent for power, press and appliances and will soon have the plant in operation. Bandon can support another paper. The Recorder is a prosperous venture and we see no reason why another may not become likewise in this growing community. We can see nothing but friendly co-operation ahead for both institutions and will do our best to promote the work for the good of the community and our friendship for the new concern.

EVERY voter should read carefully the pamphlet containing the measures to be referred to the people at the next election. As there are 124 pages of it, covering some weighty problems, it is "up to you to get busy." We have put ourselves to the task of legislating directly and here is the test as to whether or not we are capable of doing the work, for it does take work and study to decide some of these questions. We can easily bring ourselves to the understanding and decision of questions of importance to ourselves and our immediate community, although some will neglect even that; and the great majority will not be able to vote understandingly on other questions involving a knowledge of the subject matter unless they do more work and study than any community of voters in the United States has ever done before.
