Major Kinney spoke to a small, but interested audience Monday night in the opera house. His speech was not of his usual brilliancy but he made many excellent points. His arraignment of Statement No. 1 called for repeated bursts of laughter. The Major said that it had taken him but two days to size up Coos Bay when he first saw it, and says it was the best thing he had ever seen. On this, his first trip to Bandon, it took him less than two hours to pronounce it the best chance in America for investors. He called attention to our excellent harbor, its easy approach, the direct proximity of the county's resources and the fact that it is, with these natural advantages, destined to a rapid growth within the next few years.

The band turned out in honor of the occasion. Colonel Muncy of Gold Beach, who has been stumping the county with Major Kinney, and who is likewise known as a "big booster," addressed the audience on the general proposition of development of the coast and especially of the Coos and Curry coast. His optimistic speech was liberally applauded. County committeeman R. H. Rosa, introduced the speakers in turn.
