\$3,000,000 Mortgage Filed on Smith Timber.

Roseburg, Or., April 24--Involving the sum of \$3,000,000 and covering immense tracts of timber in Southern Oregon and Northern California, the largest mortgage of deed of trust ever filed in the office of the County Clerk of Douglas has just been presented for recording. The mortgage has been executed to secure a loan for the amount of money mentioned, and repayment is provided by 6 per cent bonds, issued on a sliding scale. The stated purposes of the loan are to meet obligations aggregating a total of \$1,000,000 and to finance lumber manufacturing projects. The lands embraced in the transaction are situated in Eldorado and Humboldt counties, Cal., and in Coos, Curry, Douglas and Lincoln counties, Or.
