Forced by the closing down of the mills on Coos Bay to seek cargoes from the Coquille river, the Hugh Hogan and the Sausalito, two schooners in the Coos Bay-Frisco lumber trade, are now loading within our harbor. We have the goods over here to supply all the vessels that can get to our wharves, and yet there are few that appreciate this fact. The Estabrook Company is among the few; they are building a new ship over on the Bay to run in connection with the Bandon, between this River and California ports and are demonstrating to our minds that they are good business men and appreciative of opportunity when they see it.

## DEMOCRATIC ORGANIZATION.

J. T. Hall of Marshfield has been elected chairman of the Coos Co. Democratic Central Committee and A. J. Sherwood of Coquille secretary. In compliance with the state primary law which provides that the precinct committeeman shall meet within a certain number of days after the primary election and organize the Democratic committeemen of the county gathered at Coquille the other day and effected an organization.

In addition to being elected chairman, Mr. Hall was also elected state committeeman. The following were elected to the State convention; J. D. Goss of Marshfield, Dr. E. E. Straw of Marshfield, A. J. Sherwood of Coquille, Dr. Stenler of Myrtle Point and Chris Rasmussen of Bandon were elected as a committee on printing.

The following were elected members of the executive and reception committee: J. W. Rennie of North Bend, E. E. Straw of Marshfield, A. J. Sherwood of Coquille, Dr. Stenler of Myrtle Point and Chris Rasmussen of Bandon.

The precinct committeeman were urged to get busy and raise funds for the campaign and for any other purpose that may be authorized. Resolutions were adopted pledging the support of the party to Statement No. 1 and indorsing and approving the administration of Governor Chamberlain.—Times.

## Disaster at Sea.

Newport, Or.—The steam Schr. Minnie E. Kenton, running from Aberdeen to San Francisco, Captain McKenna, met with disaster during the severe storm Friday night. The deck load shifted and strained the vessel so that she sprung a leak. On Saturday, a big wave struck the vessel, washed the deck load and cabin overboard, leaving the vessel waterlogged and unmanageable and the deck awash.

Eleven of the crew were drowned while attempting to launch a boat. Four succeeded in getting out on a raft and endeavored to reach the shore near Otter Rock, fifteen miles from here. Three of the men washed overboard and the survivor sustained a broken leg.

The life-saving crew of this port took nine men out of the vessel and landed them near Otter Rock.

The Minnie E. Kenton was loaded with lumber and when last seen had been picked up by another schooner going North.
