

**Suicide at Marshfield.**

Andrew Sudderland of Marshfield, 28 years old, was found dead in Simpson Park at North Bend Friday morning, his throat being cut from ear to ear. A coroner's jury after thoroughly investigating the affair returned a verdict of suicide.

Sudderland disappeared the day before yesterday and his relatives becoming anxious about his absence this morning organized a searching party. Within a short time after the searching party had started on its quest, the body was found in the park, about twenty or thirty feet from the roadway.

The razor was still grasped in his lifeless hands. The coat and vest were folded and lying on the grass near the body. The death stroke had been dealt with an unwavering hand, the one slash having almost severed the head.

It is believed that the deed was committed Wednesday night—Times.
