J. J. Lamb, democratic nominee for county treasurer came down from Coquille Tuesday to see the fleet and remained over Wednesday shaking hands with his friends in Bandon.

In the competitive drill there were only two teams entered: Bandon and North Bend, and the pennant, which consisted of a beautiful banner, displaying the emblems of the order, was won by Bandon. The contest was a spirited one throughout and both teams did excellent work, but the judges concluded that our boys were a little better than the North Bend, awarding them the decision by eighty-four points. The Bandon boys are loud in their praise of the royal treatment they received. The convention will be held in Bandon next year and the home team will have to defend the banner. One of the features of the convention was the fourth degree which consisted of a double wedding in the hall about 5 o'clock in the evening. The decks were cleaned and two of Marshfield's K. P. boys, with their brides-to-be leaning on their arms, entered the hall and were united in the holy bonds of matrimony after which a fine banquet was served.

The convention was a grand success, and much credit is due District Deputy Grand Chancellor R. D. Mast, who had the preparation for the convention in hand for his untiring efforts in the work.

Mrs. N. B. Neely who resided for many years on the old Uican farm near Port Orford, died Monday of last week at Bandon, after a few hours illness of heart trouble. Mrs. Neely, nee Mary E. Downing, was born in Iowa, January 30, 1851, and came with her husband from Denver Colorado, to Port Orford, in 1884, where they raised a family of three daughters and two sons, the youngest of which is fourteen years of age. The two oldest daughters are married and reside in Bandon. Mrs. Neely was a lady of culture and fine character. She will be greatly missed in the family circle, and the bereaved loved ones have the sympathy of all in their time of great sorrow.

The men were thus held in check for a time but the radical element finally succeeded in calling the strike.

Fruit Inspector Coming.

M. G. Pohl, fruit inspector for Coos county will be in Bandon in about a week and will make this city his headquarters while he inspects the fruit of the surrounding country.

Mr. Pohl will probably address the business men of Bandon on subjects of interest to the town and surrounding community, while here. An address from this gentleman would meet with the approval of all our progressive citizens.

Mr. Pohl also advises the Recorder that Mr. Newell, president of the horticultural department and Mr. Carson commissioner of the third district of which Coos county is a member will be here in June. Their time will be taken at North Bend, Marshfield, and Myrtle Point June 11, 12 and 13 and that they would be pleased to visit Bandon and deliver an address June 9 or 10. This is an opportunity which Bandon people should grasp as it will be of great benefit to all interested in the development of the community. Arrangements should be made at once to secure these gentlemen.
