Land Grant Suit Begins.

The bill of complaint in the suit of the Government against the Ore. & Cal. (Southern Pacific) Co. to restore to the public domain nearly 3,000,000 acres of valuable land now held by that corporation will be filed in the United States Court in Ashland in a few days. Tracy C. Becker, special assistant to the United States Attorney-General, yesterday said that B. D. Townsend, ex-United States Attorney for South Dakota, who will be associated with Mr. Becker in the prosecution of this important suit, would reach Portland some time this week from Washington. Immediately following Mr. Townsend's arrival, bills in equity, which have already been prepared, will be filed and suit instituted to restore to the Government these lands, that they may be open to proper settlement and improvement by settlers as was originally contemplated in the grant to the railroad corporation.
