CONGRESSMAN W. C. Hawley has returned to his home from Washington and has taken up work in his office which will occupy most of his time for the summer. Mr. Hawley has stated that most of his time would be taken up in preparing appropriation bills for Oregon rivers and harbors, which will be presented at the next session of Congress. There was no river and harbor bill at the last session but the bill will come up at the next. Mr. Hawley has been in conference with Hon. Thomas E. Burton of Ohio, Chairman of the river and harbor committee and it is stated that Mr. Hawley thinks the chances for appropriations for Western Oregon are good, and special mention is made of Coos Bay, Oregon City, and Yaquina, but there does not seem to be any men in a line of the Coquille river. This would be a good opportunity for some of our business men to get busy and show Congressman Hawley the merits of the Coquille river ferry, which can easily be made the best between the Columbia river and San Francisco. The steps taken by our business men to straighten the channel, in which proposition they expect to expend about \$6,000, are commendable to the highest degree, and if the congressmen knew of the determination on the part of these men to help themselves, it would no doubt have a good effect upon him. Why not appoint a committee of influential business men to call on Congressman Hawley and place before him the merits of our case? It would do no harm and might result in a good appropriation which would mean much to Bandon and the Coquille river.

Some Persons Imitate Unconsciously the Actions of Others.

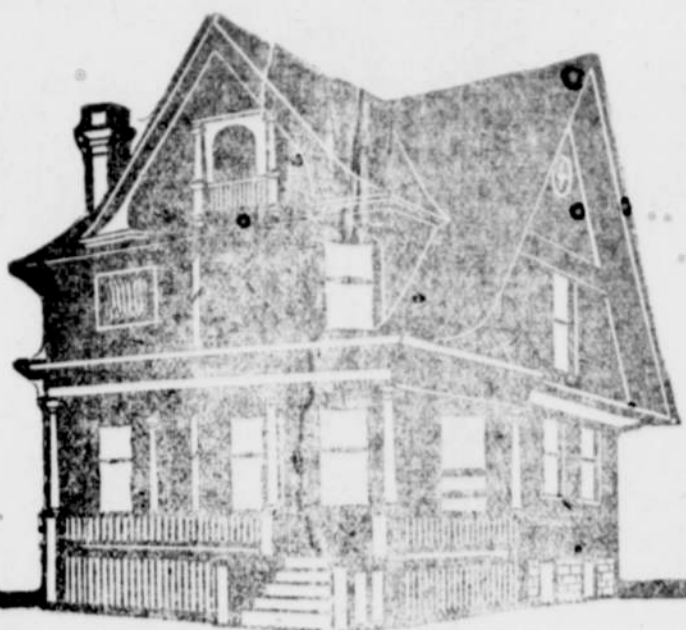
"Have you ever noticed," asked an observant physician the other day, "how persons who have something on their minds imitate unconsciously the actions of others?"
