Saloons and breweries on July 1st went out of business in all southern Oregon counties except Jackson, where the recent prohibition election was declared void by the circuit court because the order of election included the city of Medford which was exempted from the sphere of the local option law by a special charter.

Judge H. K. Hanna issued an injunction, on application of R. G. Smith and E. E. Kelly, attorneys for county liquor dealers, restraining the county court from declaring prohibition in effect in the county. The permanent injunction already secured prevented the enforcement of prohibition in Medford.

From Jackson county boundary to Marion County, a stretch of nearly 300 miles and from the coast to Lake county, 300 miles is now dry territory. The Roseburg brewery will make beer and the Grants Lumber Brewery, denatured alcohol. Saloons have been offering their stock at sacrifice prices and will ship remaining stocks back to wholesalers.

Medford is the only large town south of Salem that remains wet.
