Coos Bay needs a railroad, so does the Coquille valley, and if Harriman does not get busy and build one, then negotiations should be opened with some other company. The Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul is building to the Pacific coast, and if they were apprised of the great resources of this country they could no doubt, be induced to push a road into it, at a very early date. A railroad is what we need and a railroad is what we must have if the best interests of the country are to be served. Let the Coos Bay cities, Coquille, Myrtle Point Bandon and the entire county get to work and we will soon accomplish what we desire. The coming meeting in August, at Marshfield, at which time the project will be discussed, should be attended by business men from all over the county, and a united effort made to induce a railroad to come this way.

The two great parties have each named their man and it is the general opinion that the two strongest available men in the country have been named. People will watch the progress of the campaign with great interest and there will be plenty of chance for oratory from young aspirants for political fame.
