The Coos Bay Times is having a subscription contest in which they are giving away a piano and other valuable prizes to the persons getting the most money for subscriptions. The piano is the leading prize and will be given to the person securing the largest list. The county is divided into districts and the person in each district securing the most subscriptions will get prize also. Bandon is the third district and Mrs. Willard F. Jones and Miss Mildred Morse have entered the contest so far. All Bandon people subscribing for the Times should give their votes to one of these ladies.

The progress being made on the subscription to the fund for straightening the Coquille River channel at this place is certainly gratifying. There is nothing in sight at the present time that will be of such great benefit to this city and to the whole Coquille Valley as the putting in of this pile jetty. The jetty will be 1900 feet long, extending from the rear of Brues's store out over the bar and the cost which is estimated at \$6,000, is only a trifle as compared with the immense amount of good to be derived from it. All the ships that come into this harbor could then sail out and in with a full cargo, and much larger ships could come into this port. It looks very much at present as if the entire amount would be secured in a few days and the work will be rapidly pushed to completion. Business men in Bandon should take hold of the proposition and those who have not already subscribed should do so at once.

SENATOR William B. Allison of Iowa who was in congress longer than any other member died at his home in Dubuque last week. Senator Allison was a man of marked ability and for a number of years was called "The wise man of the senate." He was a man of exemplary habits and was never accused of any political crookedness. He was at one time a formidable candidate for the Republican nomination for president but was defeated at the National convention. His work will go down into history as being of the substantial kind, although he never posed as a great orator.

WITH the completion of the North Bank Board Portland is now in closer touch with the eastern district than ever before and with these increased transportation facilities she will give Seattle a chase for her money. Seattle makes bigger pretensions than Portland, but the Oregon City is the more substantial of the two and, if present indications keep up, will outclass the Sound city before many years. It is hoped that it will not be more than a year or two at most until all this section will be in direct communication with Portland, with a good trunk line of railroad. We need the railroad and must have it.

Roosevelt to Keep Hands off

New York, Aug. 10—Chairman Hitchcock left today for Oyster Bay where he will be the guest of President Roosevelt at luncheon. He admitted that he expected a

discussion of the New York governorship nomination.

He discouraged the suggestion that as a result of the conference there may be an official expression of preference of the National Republican leaders for the nomination of Hughes or the naming of some other man.

He reiterated that the President had not deviated from his policy of not taking sides in the matter.

Three Killed when Wall Caves in

Three men were killed today by the caving in of a wall onto to an immense steam drum encased in a cement structure at St. Johns Home for Boys.

Charles Timothy, one of the workmen, was caught under the wall and the entire lower portion of his body was burned by the escaping steam. He begged the others to kill him.

He was compelled to suffer intense agony until he was removed.

ALTERATION OF STREET GRADE

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Bandon, Coos County, Oregon, by resolution duly passed, and entered in the Journal of proceedings proposes to alter the grade upon Pacific Avenue (otherwise known as Little Street) between the intersections thereof with Atwater and Sixth Street, said grade to be changed from a one per cent and a ten per cent grade, to three grades of 1, 6, to 7 and 12 per cent grades, and thereafter to grade the said portion of said Street, for the whole width thereof, in accordance with the grade so established, and to build a sidewalk on both sides thereof, and to repeal the ordinance establishing the present grade thereon.

Notice is further given that unless two-thirds of the property owners of and upon such street, shall file a written remonstrance with the Recorder within ten days from the final publication hereof, which said publication will be upon the 13 day of August, 1908, then an Ordinance will be passed by the Board of Trustees re-establishing the grade thereon, providing for the actual grading of the said Street, for building sidewalks thereon, and for assessing the cost thereof upon the adjacent property owners, and repealing the present ordinance.
