

**The Work of the Newspapers**

The newspaper in a town says more good things of its possibilities and attractions every day in a way that is productive of greater benefits than all other agencies combined. The newspaperman is so universally expected to boom the town in and out of season that if at any time in his judgment it appears necessary to criticize conditions in any respect he is hopped onto as a knocker. He is supposed to be the town boomer and usually meets every expectation along that line. In the Echo Register we find this analysis of the newspaper man's work in his community and the reward he generally reaps for his efforts:

"Did you ever think of it? Suppose every business man in a town took as much interest in the upholding of the town and forwarding all public enterprises as the newspaper man. He works for railroads, manufactories, schools and churches, good streets and badgers and cavorts around generally. Imagine his feeling then when some lame, stringhalted kind of a fellow reproaches him because he doesn't boom things enough. If the town does boom and the owners grow rich from the results of his labor, he makes nothing by it. He is like the poor boy and the pictures without the necessary price of admission."—Coos Bay Times.

**Prosperity's Smile Much in Evidence**

New York, Nov. 11—Reports on business conditions and outlook have been made by 33 high class technical and trade papers in the East to the American Trade Press Association, of which they are members. The papers represent lines from groceries and textiles to cooperage and boiler making.

The report of the New York Real Estate Record and Guide is typical and fairly expresses the consensus of opinion. "Conditions are in very much brighter shape than they were six months ago. A better and firmer tone and greater activity exists. The outlook for the coming year is most encouraging."

The Railroad Age said: "There was no change until August last when the railroads and manufacturers alike began to anticipate a safe and sane election. While the election has only just been decided, the result is highly satisfactory to the industry we represent. While reports of orders within the last two days have in some cases been grossly exaggerated, nevertheless there is a decided improvement and the indications are that the demands will be large and immediate."

**Drinks Own Blood and Saves Life**

St Paul, Minn., Nov. 11—Kept alive and given strength by drinking his own blood which oozed from a bullet wound in his forehead and trickled down into his mouth, Martin McDonough last night in a local hospital told how he had been mistaken for a burglar when about to enter the house of C. A. Stickney by mistake; was shot by the negro coachman; was deserted by his two companions and then walked six miles to Mendota to secure medical aid. Local physicians say that if McDonough had not drunk his own blood he would not have lived. Although he has a bullet lodged in the back of his head, he was able to walk around his room last night and physicians say he will recover.

**Police Force Dismissed**

Klamath Falls, Or., Nov. 10—The entire police force of Klamath Falls has been dismissed by the city council, on account of complaint that they were not doing their duty in enforcing the liquor and gambling laws. Chief C. G. Low declared the action unjust, as they were not given opportunity to resign. New officers will be appointed by the mayor.

J. V. Houston, C. L. Reed, and others, arrested this week at the time the sheriff made a raid on the Flite saloon, waived examination before the county judge, and were bound over to the grand jury in the sum of \$500.

**Sues Magazine for \$250,000 Damages**

Reno, Nev.—Nov. 11—"Diamondfield Jack" Davis, of Goldfield, has entered suit in the United States Court at Carson City against the Curtis Publishing Co., of Philadelphia, for \$250,000 damages, for what he terms malicious libel. He complains that in a recent issue of the Saturday Evening Post he is represented as the villain in a murder story, the scene of which is laid in Goldfield. The name of the villain is "Diamond Jack," and Davis says he is sure he is the person meant. The circumstances of the story are pointed out so minutely he says that the malice is very evident. James Hopper, author of the story, resided in Goldfield for a time.
