An article from Washington that has been appearing in the daily papers states that Secretary Garfield has made the ruling that hereafter no timber or stone lands will be sold at the flat rate of \$2.50 per acre, but that they will be sold at appraised valuation, the applicant making appraisal, to be afterward appraised by the government within nine months. One of the Portland papers heads the article "Timber Grafters Hit." The general opinion here is that this is an ideal ruling for the "grafters" and very much against the interests of the poor man who cannot or will not pay appraised value for timber with the chances of making but a small profit on the deal. The rich man and the scrippers will profit materially if the ruling remains unmodified. It is doubtful, however if a custom that has been standing for so many years can be crumpled by one fell sweep of the secretary of the interior. It is extremely likely that Congress may have something to say in the matter. A department that is looking closely to the interest of the people might better insist that the large railroad and wagon road grants be sold to actual settlers at the prices established by the government—or at least sold to Myrtle Point Enterprise.
