### -000--Law Guards Shellfish

Salem, Or. April 1-House bill No. 145, passed by the recent regular session of the Oregon Legislalaw prohibits the taking of clams to during June, July and August and have in their possession any crawcrawfish, except as to the residents or February of any year. of Clatsop county:

The law says:

Section I. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation, or any person whatsoever, to take, or fish from any of of the waters of the State of Oregon, and can same, any male or female crab measuring less than six inches across its back.

Section 2 It shall be unlawful for Three milch cows, coming in this corporation, to kill, take, or fish year.
