The proposition of incorporating platted districts adjacent to Bandon was put to vote of the people in these sections and defeated by a ratio of to three to one and so far as we have been able to learn the only objection to coming in is the fear of a little extra taxes that the property owners might have to pay, while some of these same property owners depend entirely on the city of Bandon for their living, and even want the city to improve the streets up to their property while at the same time they are unwilling to contribute their part toward such improvements.




