A fast mail train between Chicago and Portland that will bring Eastern mail to Oregon in much less time than is now required has just been put on by the Harriman lines. The train will carry no passengers and will make the run between the two cities in 60 or 62 hours, clipping off from 10 to 12 hours from the present schedule. In this way the Harriman lines expect to meet the shortened schedules of the Hill roads, which have put in fast trains from St. Paul to Puget Sound.

All our exchanges in Southern Oregon and Northern California are teeming with railroad news. The coast line is to be built at once, and many short lines are to reach the coast from several interior points. Certainly some of them will materialize, and the signs are favorable for several. The greatest forests in the world are on the immediate Pacific coast, and rival railroads kings know these forests and want to haul the lumber they will furnish. With railroads actually building, a short time will usher in such a boom all along the coast, as our country never before experienced. —Port Orford Tribune.

A citizens' meeting was called here last Saturday evening for the purpose of organizing a development league. A good interest was shown, being about 40 citizens present, including the representatives from different points as far up the Rogue as the Bend and as far south as Harbor. All were enthusiastic in the belief that nothing would prove so beneficial to the country in general, as a few dollars spent in this way in advertising the many wonderful resources of Curry. Judge Bailey was elected president; W. A. Wood, secretary, and Alf Miller, treasurer. One of the first projects to be undertaken is a wagon road up the river to connect with the forestry trail, now only a few miles from the Curry-Josephine line. —Gold Beach Globe.
