Shall we use it here in the Coquille Valley. The dairymen are getting together for this purpose. But there are many other items of produce, fruit, hay, potatoes, hogs, etc. Let us market these together. Let us arrange with the steamers to put in cold storage facilities and market our little lots of one thing and another under a common brand, and from one central organization. This business can all be handled through the grange. I hope to see it done. If the Bandon grange receives the support of the ranchers this central exchange can be easily arranged.

This is my pet idea. I intend to talk of it in season and out of season, as long as the editor of the

RECORDER gives me space. But the important point is that now is the time to organize anything in this line. Let us get busy.

Saturday, December 4, that is the date of the next grange meeting. There will be a meeting of members of the order at 10 o'clock. An intermission will be held for lunch at 12 o'clock. At 1 p. m. an open meeting will be held to discuss the question I have been talking about, namely cooperative selling. If you are interested come out.
