WILL IMPROVE THE RIVERS AND HARBORS

Hope for Large Appropriations for Work at This Session of Congress

GREAT THING FOR PACIFIC NORTHWEST

Portland, Or., December 28-Much work on the rivers and harbors of the Pacifie Northwest will be accomplished during the coming year provided the recommendations of Major McIndoe, corps of United States Engineers, in charge of this district are followed. Major Mc-Indoe has just made his annuil report to the Secretary of War and urges the expenditure of \$2,042, 500 in river and harbor improve ments in this district for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1911.

The largest appropriation rec ommended is \$1,560,000 for con tinuing the improvement at the mouth of the Columbia river. The sum of \$1,000,000 is urged for work in the same stream between the Dalles rapids and Celilo Falls. The remainder of the desired appropria tion is divided between the difterent coast harbors and work on the Columbia, Willamette, Snake and other rivers, including the Cowlitz, Grays and Lewis rivers in Washington.
