### STATISTICAL RECORDS.

ELEVEN million eight hundred and three thousand bales of cotton were used by the world last year, according to an exchange.

SWITZERLAND had 2,359 mechanical establishments, using a total of 82,393 horse power, of which 54,243 was supplied by water, 27,432 by steam, 394 by gas, 332 by electricity.
