### THE FAMINE IN INDIA.

Those who feared that the American relief cargoes have been withheld too long to be of much use in mitigating the terrors of the Indian famine will learn. with special interest, that more people are dying of hunger in India than at any previous time since the failure of the crops. The details, as given by a returned missionary, are pitiable. There is no seed left among the farmers to sow, the plowing oxen have died, the grain dealers ask ruinous prices for their commodity and the native officials whose duty it is to distribute food, rob the people, who are thus compelied to subsist on roots and grass. All in all. between the rayages of famine and plague, the population of the stricken districts has been diminished by nearly 8,000,000 souls. It is a loss equal numerically, to that of the entire number of inhabitants of the states of New York and New Jersey.

While the British government is that a single season of drought and crops leaves the people face to with death in one of its most appalling forms. It is said there is plenty of grain in India, but that the inhabitants cannot afford to buy it, even in the few places where it is offered for sale at low price. Why cannot they afford to? Is it not because the British government has taxed them to the limit and at the same time reduced the purchasing and paying power of their savings by closing the mint to the free coinage of silver? When to this responsibility is added that of the defective administration which permits corners and trusts in grain and turns over to corrupt native officials the work of distributing relief, it will be seen that England has enough to answer for in this matter to put her under the strongest moral obligations to keep life in the gaunt bodies of the queen's Indian subhis wisdom in performing it. in the present case, is a package as put up by the manufacturer, which is not broken in its progress to the consumer after its importation into this state. The package may be small, and it may be packed with many others of like character in a box, a barrel, a car o any other receptacle for safety or con- tant venience of conveyance, but if it is as originally filled, labeled, stamped or sealed it is original in the view of the law. The package is the bottle, flask, jug, demijohn or keg of liquor, not the packing case that may hold it with ported and sold without payment of

license, there is an end to all restraint of the liquor traffic, short of its absolute prohibition as illegal.

It will be remembered that the original "original package" decision of the supreme court held that liquor could be carried into the state of Iowa and sold in original packages, in spite of the prohibition law of the state. This made Senater Hoar's report in favor a great sensation, and, at its next session after the decision, congress overcame its effect by enacting that liquor was not a legitimate article of interstate commerce, against which the states were powerless to legislate as respects importation and sale in original pack-


