TROUBLE IN MANILA.

The Insurgents Makea Night Attack.

But Are Driven Back.

125 Americans Wounded and 20 Killed. The Fight Still in Progress.

Telegram from Manila the 5th brings news of a fight between the Americans

The fight commenced Saturday evening at 8:40 when three Filippinos darted past the Nebraska regiment but retired when challenged. On their doing this the third time one of the American sentries fired killing one and wounding another. An ineffectual firing was commenced almost immediately by the Filippinos.

There were several fusibiles during the night and the Americans replied vigorously. The cruiser Charleston, gunboat Concord and monitor Monadnock opened fire on the enemy during

With daylight the Americans advanced and drove the Filipinos from their position. There was intermittent firing from various points all day.

The first dispatch estimated the American loss at 125 wounded and 20 killed. General Otis estimates the


